The proximate cause of the crisis was the rise in the exchange owing to the excessive amount of paper money in circulation. Forced currency was first introduced in 1868, when 15, 000, 000 dr. in paper money was issued; it was abolished in the following year, but reintroduced in 1877 with a paper issue of 44, 000, 000 dr. It was abolished a second time in 1884, but again put into circulation in 1885, when paper loans to the amount of 45, 000, 000 dr. were authorized. In 1893 the total authorized...
